New Bounce Back Loan – announced 27th April

The Government has announced a new 100% Government backed loan scheme for small businesses.

Small businesses will benefit from a new fast-track finance

scheme providing loans with a 100% government-backed guarantee for lenders, the Chancellor announced yesterday.

- Businesses will be able to borrow between £2,000 and £50,000 and access the cash within days.
- Loans will be interest free for the first 12 months, and businesses can apply online through a short and simple form.
- Loan terms will be up to 6 years.
- No repayments will be due during the first 12 months.

The scheme will <u>launch for applications on Monday 4 May</u>. Businesses will be able to access these loans through a network of accredited lenders. We would advise our clients to speak to their own banks in the first instance. The government will work with lenders to ensure loans delivered through this scheme are advanced as quickly as possible and agree a low standardised level of interest for the remaining period of the loan.
